Cornelia Butler Flora, Charles F. Curtiss Distinguished Professor of Agriculture and Sociology Emerita at Iowa State University and Research Professor Kansas State University, served 15 years as Director of the North Central Regional Center for Rural Development. She has over four decades of work asset-based community development, using community capitals: natural, cultural, human, social, political, financial, and built, in the U.S., Canada, Spain and developing countries. Her current research addresses alternative strategies of community development and community-based natural resource management in light of changing socio-technical regimes and climate change.

Her books include: *Interactions Between Agroecosystems and Rural Communities*; *Rural Communities: Legacy and Change (5 editions)*; *Rural Policies for the 1990s*; and *Sustainable Agriculture in Temperate Zones*.
